A number of months ago our city Mayor, Ben Hillyard, and Salem City's Mayor, Cristy Simons, got together and decided that it would benefit both cities to periodically have an informal lunch with the two mayors and a few office staff to discuss items of mutual interest as well as joint concerns which might exist. This past week such a luncheon was held and hosted by Mayor Hillard with some of the Woodland Hills office staff and was attended by Mayor Simmons and several of her office staff. A few of the items discussed included updates on the Three Bridges development, our two cities shared responsibilities with our ambulance services, work along Woodland Hills Drive that affects both of our cities, and the relocation of our city's mail boxes, in addition to the upcoming Salem Days celebration which starts on Saturday, August 1. For a list of Salem Days events and activities, please see Salem City's web page for the week's events, culminating with a fireworks display over Salem Pond on Saturday, August 8. An invitation was given to Woodland Hills residents to attend any and all activities by Salem's Mayor.

As an update on the mail boxes. It appears that it is taking longer than initially anticipated. Work will likely not start until next spring. Acquiring additional land by the county for rights of way around the present round-a-bout and other areas is taking longer than expected. The county's re-design of the larger round-a-bout is completed but it is too late in the year to move forward with new construction and to have it completed before year's end with new road building, surfacing, etc., as well as the timely completion of a new mail box facility for our city.
