Woodland Hills News

City Government

- The City's attorney, David Church, met with the City Council and advised them on several issues. He said that the Council can put the City's salt storage in any part of the City they feel is best as long as the area is zoned for that purpose. He said that the City can regulate signs for time, manner and place, but they cannot regulate them based on content. He stated that the City's firearm ordinance must follow the State's law.
- Don Mecham (developer) presented his proposal for a new housing development in the City. It is tentatively called "The Peaks" and it will be a gated community. A proposed new road directly accessing the development would start at 11200 S near the west end of the City. Construction traffic would primarily use that new road. The road will also provide another entrance to and exit from the City. Construction on the new road will begin as soon as possible.
- The Mayor and City Council are exploring the possibility of drilling a new water well to provide an additional water source to the City. This may be done in partnership with Elk Ridge.
- The City is acquiring an alarm system to alert citizens in case of an emergency. The system is being donated to the City by the Tooele Army Depot. The current plan calls for installation of three active alarms and a fourth that will remain inactive for the present. The three alarms will provide full coverage for all developed portions of the City. The system operates on batteries charged by solar cells. Each alarm will have omni-directional speakers sitting atop tall telephone poles. It is expected that the system will be far more effective than our old system that was decommissioned years ago. A map showing the proposed pole locations is included in this newsletter. The system should be up and running before the fire threat becomes high.
- The City's Public Works Department is currently being run in partnership with Elk Ridge. Resources are being shared when possible.

Wood Chipping In May

In collaboration with the Utah Department of Natural Resources we are pleased to announce that the "chipper crews" will be back in Woodland Hills on Monday, May 21st, 2011. Your chipping piles need to be stacked prior to Monday morning (May 21st) since they will only be making one pass through the city. This is a continuing effort in making Woodland Hills a *Safer Place to Live*.

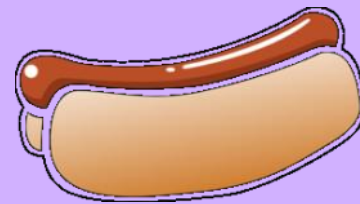
