City Government

- The City received a \$1,000 recreational grant from the County to apply to repairs at the park.
- The City Council reviewed a proposal to expand the City Center parking lot on the east side of the building. It will cost about \$70,000 and will add about 35 parking stalls. The Council is in favor of the plan to this point.
- The new road from 11200 South to Woodland Hills Drive will be called Summit Creek Drive.
- The City Council reviewed the proposed monuments in the Summit Creek Development. The Council is generally in favor of the idea but asked for specific details before final approval next month.
- The City is planning to start drilling the new well by the water tanks in May. The Council reviewed the final specifications and asked for clarification on the proposal prior to granting final approval of the project.
- The new salt storage facility is nearly complete.

What TO bring:

- Medications
- Gasoline / fuels / motor oil / lubricants
- Antifreeze
- Solvents / paint thinners
- Aerosol cans / paints / stains
- Pesticides / herbicides
- Glues / adhesives
- Fluorescent light bulbs
- Mercury thermometers
- Photographic chemicals
- Electronics (limit 2 sets per vehicle)
- Paper shredding
- Glass bottles and jars

What NOT to bring:

- Containers over 5 gallons in size
- Ammunition / explosives
- Compressed gas tanks / propane tanks
- Asbestos materials
- PCB- related materials
- Medical / biological waste
- Radioactive waste
- Fire extinguishers
- Business / commercial / construction waste
- Tires

Please do not mix wastes. Bring in original containers if possible. Waste must be capped or sealed.

It is very hard to predict what the fire season will bring and being prepared will help us get through it the best we can. Practice your family evacuation plan and review your list of items to take with you. Start cleaning up dead leaves and debris that has blown into the pockets around your home and structures. Clean out your BBQ. These are just a few items you can do to be prepared. Please remember that by making your home Fire Wise you are protecting not only you and your loved ones but your neighbors and our beautiful city as well. These simple thing could save lives.

While we are doing the wood chipping program again this year, please **do not** start piling wood along the road until we announce the date that these piles can be started. In the event we dry out prior to the chipper date you will be required to remove the piles at your expense to ensure the safety of our neighbors. We are trying to push it a bit later this year to make sure everyone can get into his or her yard without walking through snow.

Put May 3rd on your calendar as this is the date for the **2014 Fire and EMS Expo** at the City Center. We will be announcing the chipper date at that time.

The new road out of town is coming along. It will soon become the access road used by construction trucks for the new development. This will take a load off of Woodland Hills Drive which is scheduled for a facelift this spring. Please be aware of detours during this time. We will also be doing some brush pile burns on the new development to remove what was taken out for the new exit.
