Please take some time to make sure the grass or weeds where your property borders the road is cut to 6 inches or less. This will help prevent a car that may be parked alongside the road from igniting the grass and spreading into the brush.

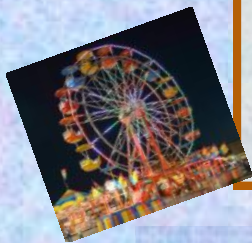
