NOVEMBER CITY NEWS

Thanks to everyone who came to the Town Hall meeting!

The following are updates that were mentioned during the meeting

1. The City is currently discussing the possibility of curbside recycling. This topic will be discussed further and voted on at the **City Council meeting on Dec. 10.**
2. The new salt storage facility, east of the mailboxes, is under construction and will be finished by the end of this year.
3. Construction of the new Summit Creek development on the west side of the city is now underway. More information can be found at **summitcreek7.com.**
4. The city recently received a \$400,000 grant for fire protection.
5. The reconstruction of Woodland Hills drive is expected to begin early Spring 2014.
6. Digis recently installed a new tower at the south end of the city.
7. CenturyLink has agreed to install another node at the south intersection of Woodland Hills Dr. and Oak Dr. That will occur after the completion of the Woodland Hills Dr. renovation.
8. The City is moving forward with the new well and expect to have it completed in Spring 2014.
9. Landscaping around the City Center will be completed in 2014.

HELP WANTED: The Utah County Foster Grandparent Program is looking for seniors 55 or older, to serve as mentors, tutors, and care givers for children and youth within community organizations such as schools, hospitals, and youth centers. There they work with trained professionals to provide assistance, support, and knowledge to children and teens with special needs. Foster Grandparents receive a small stipend (about \$200 per month), monthly training, and in some areas, mileage reimbursement or transportation to the volunteer facility.

Volunteers must be income eligible (earn less than \$1915 per month for a single person and \$3102 for a married person), be willing to serve 15 or more hours per week and have the desire to help others. This is a fun and rewarding way to serve in your community!
