City Government

- We have had some minor issues with the new asphalt on Woodland Hills Dr. Our engineer, in talking with the contractor, told us to hold out 25% until the issues had been remedied.
- Preparing for measuring the capacity of the new water well. The process may be delayed to avoid dumping large amounts of water on the side of the hill during winter months.
- Corbett has completed the needed repairs on the second booster pump. The City will budget to do similar repairs on the other booster pump next year.
- South Utah Valley Solid Waste District sees construction of a new multi-million dollar waste handling facility on the horizon. It is anticipated that this will result in an increased cost to each resident of a few dollars.
- The Planning Commission is busy reviewing the General Plan.
- Four City Council positions are open for election this November. The term for those positions is January, 2016 through 2020. (See page 3 for more details.)

I hope the New Year is treating you all well. So far our winter has been a mild one but I know that will change in the near future. I have a few items I would like to bring to your attention.

During our medical and fire calls it is very important for us to be able to see the house number at the edge of the street. While some homes are clearly marked, others have no markings at all. Although this may be fine for the UPS diver to take some extra time to find the address, we cannot afford the time looking for the number or possibly going to the wrong house. During one of our recent calls we were able to count on the neighbor's well-marked address to guess which house we were responding to. Starting when the 911 call is made to the time that we start patient care is the most critical time of the call. Seconds can make the difference as to whether we are able to save a life during a medical call or save your home in the event of a fire. Please make sure your house number is visible day or night from both directions as we never know which way we will approach your home. Please make this a topic when talking to neighbors.

The other item I would like to touch on is an open flame. It appears that we still have some residents that are not sure what an open flame is. For everyone's safety it is unlawful to burn anything outside of your BBQ or indoor fireplace other than liquid fuel (propane or natural gas). Even with the snow on the ground you cannot burn any solid materials outside. Thank you for adhering to this rule.

That is all I have for this month. Have a great February and please have fun and be safe, wherever your travels take you.

2015 Woodland Hills City Election Notice

The City of Woodland Hills will hold a non-partisan municipal General Election on Tuesday,
November 3, 2015.

Positions Available for the 2015 Election

Four (4) Council Members to each serve 4-year terms of Office

January 2016 – 2020

If more than two candidates file for an office, a primary election will be held on
Tuesday, August 11, 2015.

To qualify for candidacy a person must meet the following requirements as outlined in state and local law:

A United States Citizen

At least 18 years old at the time of the next election

A resident of the municipality, or a recently annexed area, for a period of 365 consecutive days immediately preceding the date of election.

A registered Voter of Utah.

In accordance with the Utah Constitution Article IV, Section 6, any mentally incompetent person, any person convicted of a felony, or any person convicted of treason or a crime against the elective franchise may not hold office in this state until the right to hold elective office is restored under Utah Code Section 20A-2-101.5.

A candidate shall file a Declaration of Candidacy in person with the City Recorder at 690 South Woodland Hills Drive, Woodland Hills, Utah, during office hours (9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m.) (Monday through Friday) between June 1 and June 8, 2015.

Any resident of a municipality may nominate a candidate for a municipal office by filing a nomination petition (with 25 signatures) with the City Recorder during office hours between June 1 and June 8, 2015.
