Wildfire in January?

Whether you've lived in Woodland Hills for years or are in your new dream home away from the hectic pace of city life, you may be concerned about wildfire. Living where wildfires can occur poses a risk to your property and loved ones — but it is possible to live compatibly with this natural event. Read on to learn more about how your participation in the Firewise Communities/USA Recognition Program can make you and your home safer.

A Community Wildfire Protection Plan (CWPP) aimed at reducing risks from wildfires in Woodland Hills is being created over the next few months. This plan will be prepared by a citizen-based committee

with the Utah Division of Forestry, Fire and State Lands, U.S. Forest Service and the Woodland Hills Fire Department as technical advisors.

The CWPP process provides an opportunity for you to give your input on the response to and prevention of wildfires in our community. It is the committee that will be directly involved in forming plans and procedures for all aspects of wildfire in our community. Your participation is needed to make this process succeed.

The Woodland Hills Fire Department invites you to give input and join our Community Wildfire Protection Planning Committee. **The meeting is at the Woodland Hills City Center on Thursday, January 6th, at 7:00 pm.**

Our Fire Chief, Val Wilding, adds:
