New Woodland Hills Off-highway Vehicle Ordinance

The city has adopted the Utah State Off-highway Vehicle law. This opens our streets for general off-highway vehicle use with the following requirements:

Vehicle License

The vehicle must be licensed in the State of Utah

Valid Utah Drivers License

With a drivers license, you will be able to operate an ATV without any training class.

Utah Off Highway Vehicle Course

Children between the ages of 8 and 16 will have to complete a state course to operate an ATV (anywhere).

The course is offered by the Utah State Parks (<http://stateparks.utah.gov/ohv/education>).

Helmet requirement

Children under 18 years old will have to wear a helmet whether they are operating or riding an ATV.

Adult Supervision

Children between 8 and 16 years old will have to be in direct supervision (within 300 feet) of an adult (18 years or older) when operating an ATV.

Speed Limit

The ATV speed limit in the city will be 20 MPH.

Required Equipment

Must have headlights and taillights if operated between sunset and sunrise.

Must have a noise control device and a spark arrestor.

Salem City Ambulance Service Volunteers Needed

Salem City Ambulance service has been in operation for 24 years as a volunteer organization. The staffing of citizen volunteers has made this organization successful in meeting the medical needs of the citizens in Salem and the surrounding area.

It seems citizen volunteerism is slowly disappearing. In recent years the ambulance association has found it hard to find individuals to staff the ambulance crews, especially for day time shifts. Fortunately a **few** dedicated individuals are covering all the daytime calls. There is also a need for night crews.

The association needs more individuals to step up and fill the vacancies. If you have experience in the medical field or would like to be trained as an EMT we need you. The city will pay for training if you need to be trained as an EMT. Serving others gives you a warm feeling inside like no other and a great sense of satisfaction. Hello Neighbors:

As one more method to help us live in a safer community, we are asking residents to clear the herbaceous and woody vegetation to at least 3 feet away from fire hydrants and those green power boxes you see around the neighborhood (that is, if they are on or near your property). Reasons for doing so for the fire hydrants are obvious – to enhance access in case of a fire. Clearing away the vegetation from the green power boxes; however, may not be as obvious. If we do have a fire that burns near them, our town's power supply may be severely compromised. The negative impacts from that happening are obvious.
