Residents of Woodland Hills

What a great spring we had — lots of moisture, wonderful temperatures and tall green grass. It was very nice. Now the summer moves in — very little moisture, near record high temperatures and tall **DEAD** grass or as we refer to it, “ladder fuel”. As we move through these dry weeks please be careful when outdoors.

I need your help in making sure the grass is less than six inches tall and there is no dead brush anywhere near our roads or structures. Take a few moments to walk around your house and clear any debris that has collected in the corners and near items that may be stored around structures. This will also be where embers may land in the event of a wildfire.

Please educate anyone that may be visiting or staying at your house about the fireworks and open flame ordinances in Woodland Hills. We continue to have zero tolerance for violation of these ordinances and urge any resident that sees or hears fireworks to call 911.

Remember that power tools can create sparks so please have a source of water available if you are working around dry grass or debris that could catch fire. Also remember to stay hydrated when working or playing outside. Young children are especially vulnerable to dehydration so make sure they drink lots of water prior to while outside in the heat.

July is a great time to celebrate with family and friends. No matter where the holidays take you, I hope you safe travels and lots of fun and remember to dial 911 if you see or smell smoke.

Thank you for taking the time to read this message. It is the hard work of the residents of Woodland Hills that has made our city a safer place to live. Through your hard work you have earned Woodland Hills the designation as a “Firewise Community”. I applaud you for this. Thank you.
