## News from the City Council

Professors Rex L. Facer and David W. Hart of the Romney Institute of Public Management at Brigham Young University reported their findings after studying the Woodland Hills financial status and fiscal needs. Major capital improvement projects considered were: new water source, new water storage tank, new water distribution lines and road improvements. They concluded that property taxes are the logical choice for road projects and fees could be used to pay for water projects. They also recommended a “pay-as-you-go” approach to finance capital improve-

ments. That translates to borrowing the money and then paying it off over the expected useful life of the asset.

Between 04/15/11 and 05/15/11 Utah County Sheriff's Deputies responded to 29 calls for service in the city of Woodland Hills. These calls included:

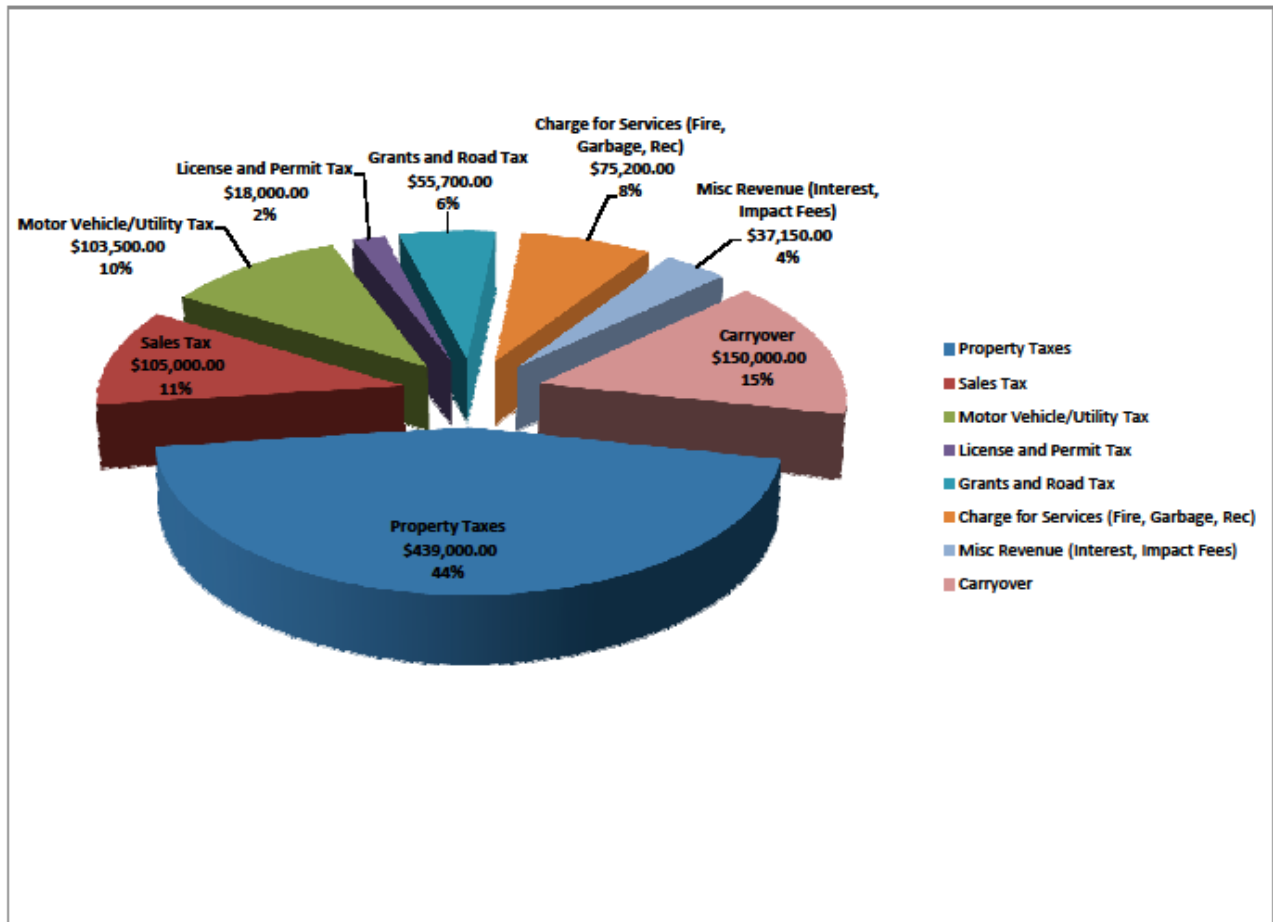

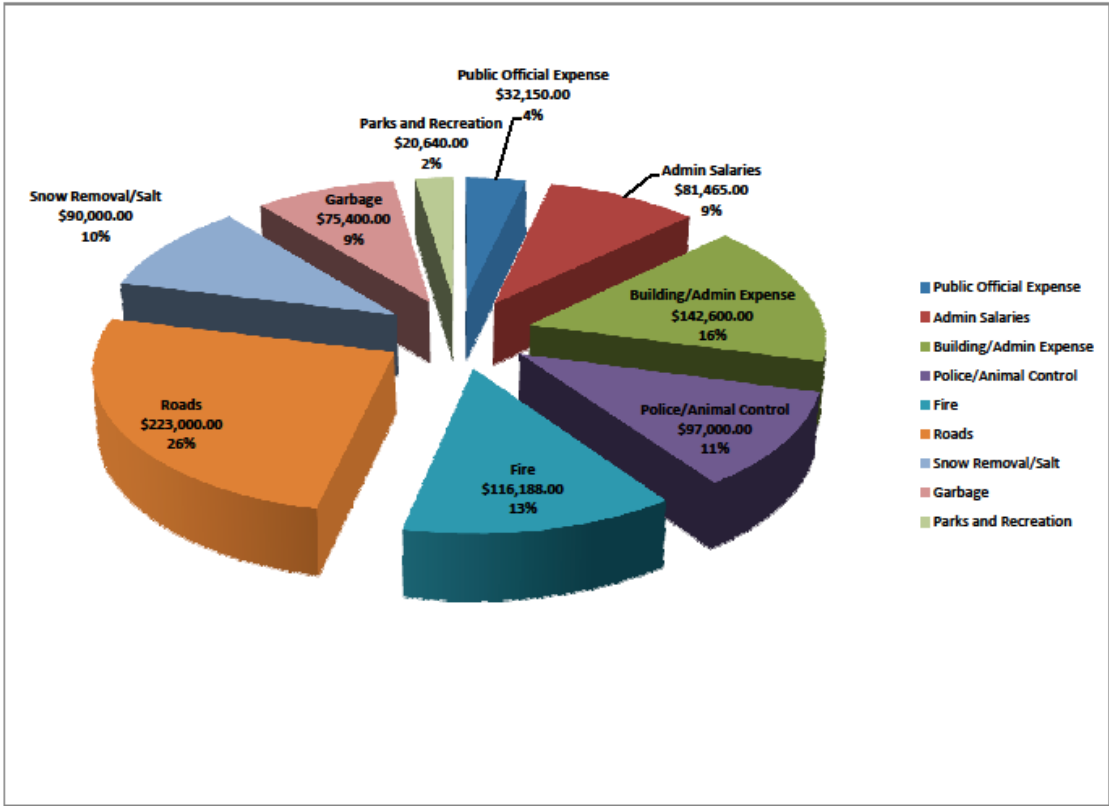
## Proposed Woodland Hills 2011-2012 Budget

**Budgeted 2011-2012 Revenues**



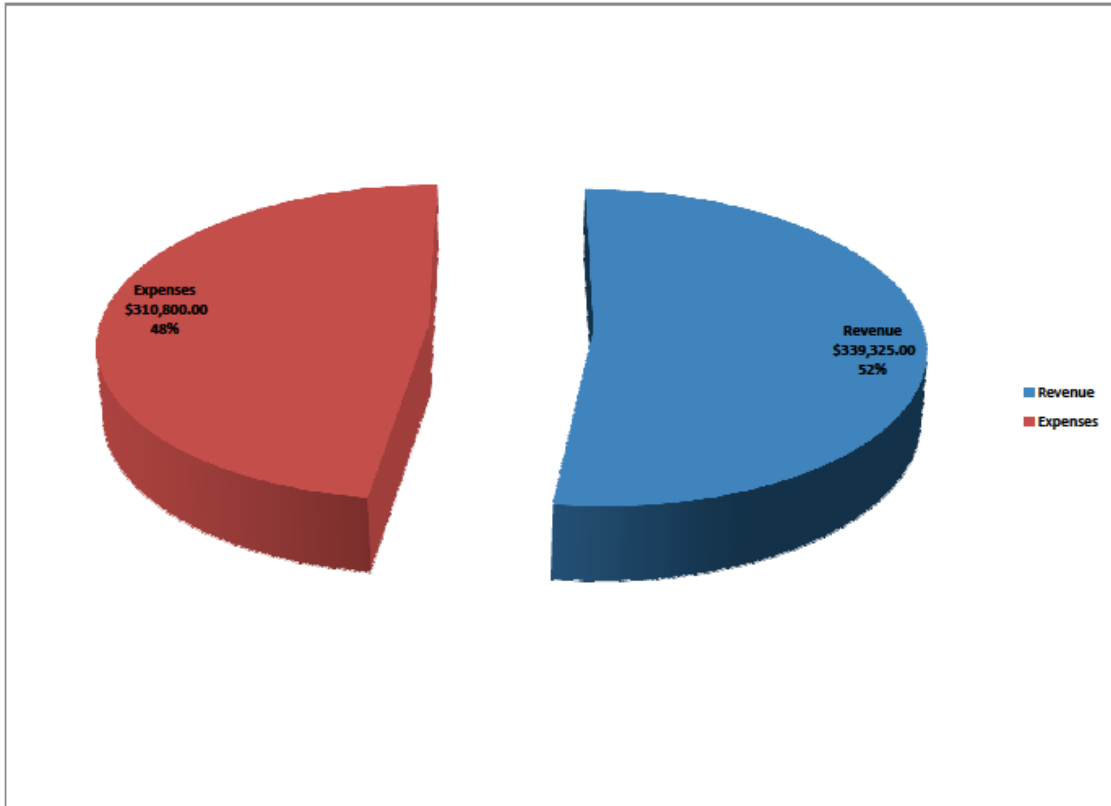
**Total Budgeted 2011-2012 Revenues \$983,550**
