Dear residents

I would like to take a few moments to cover some accomplishments our department achieved in 2013. The department currently has 26 active members that frequently respond to calls. Of those 26, we have 13 that are fire 1&2 certified, 12 that are wild land certified, 14 EMTB certified, 5 EMTA certified and 2 paramedics. Although we are only allowed to treat a patients at the level of EM-TA the experience that the 2 paramedics bring is amazing.

Along with the certifications our members logged over 3500 hours of training through the year. This includes fire and medical. I would also like to mention the time that is spent helping other organizations within our community. These include assisting the scouts earn their First Aid Merit badges, CPR classes and Basic First Aid for the Young Women's group.

We would like to thank our residents and council for the support that we have received. We truly love what we do and whom we do it for.

The last thing I have is we are still looking for two more residents that can help with the Community Wildfire Protection Plan (CWPP). We have been awarded a grant for \$300,000.00 that will help make our city a safer place to live. The CWPP board will help determine how this money is spent.
