City Government

- The City Council received an update on the well. A new well house is currently being designed.
- The City Council is still working on ordinance education.
- The City Council voted not to fund a job/compensation analysis study at this time.
- The City Council discussed purchasing a larger snow plow and assuming the responsibility for snow removal.
- The City Council reviewed new solid waste disposal contracts and discussed implementation of curbside recycling.
- The City Council adopted ordinance 2015-01 changing the time for filing declaration of candidacy. To run for City Council the dates to declare candidacy are June 1 - June 8, 2015.
- The City Council approved a revision of Plat B for Summit Creek Subdivision. The revision was a reduction from six lots to five.
- The City Council approved a monument gate at the intersection of Summit Creek Drive and Woodland Hills Drive.
- The City Council received updates and discussed Woodland Hills Drive reconstruction and additional road projects.
