General Election

Tuesday, November 8, 2011

Woodland Hills City will hold a general election for three City Council positions. The General Election will take place on Tuesday, November 8, 2011, from 7:00 AM to 8:00 PM at the Woodland Hills Community Center located at 690 S. Woodland Hills Dr, Woodland Hills, UT 84653.

Early Voting will be held at the Woodland Hills City Offices from October 25th – November 4th (Tues.-Fri.) from 9:00 AM – 1:00 PM. There will also be early voting available on the evening of Thursday, November 3rd, from 6:00 PM – 8:00 PM.

Utah Legislative HB 126: Requires voters to show to the poll worker in order to vote: a photo identification, or two forms of identification that bear the name of the voter and residence.

Please remember that there is to be no campaigning within 150 feet of the polling location.

As members of the Fire Department, the majority of what we do is to react to problems. We have done prevention through public education as well as clearing dead trees around the city. There are ways to prevent house and wild fires. One way is by having your chimney properly inspected and cleaned a minimum of every two years, by doing this you can prevent sparks, embers, or even a fire plume from igniting your home or the surrounding trees which make our city so beautiful. Chimney fires are very dangerous and can put lives at risk and cause thousands of dollars of damage.

I recently had one of our Firefighters come inspect and clean my chimney. I thought it was clean since I had it done just a few years ago and don't burn a tremendous amount, but quite a bit of soot was removed. This cost very little (\$75) for this piece of mind. During the final few weeks of October, Hunter Isaacson was working hard on an Eagle project. He chose to assist the fire department and incoming agencies in marking the road where our fire hydrants exist with a painted reflective arrow. This is a very valuable tool that will save time when searching for a hydrant in the event of a fire. The minutes that will be saved are extremely important and may save lives. Thank you Hunter Isaacson for your hard work to make our community a safer place to live.

We do, however, still need residents to make sure the hydrant on your property is clear of brush and snow.

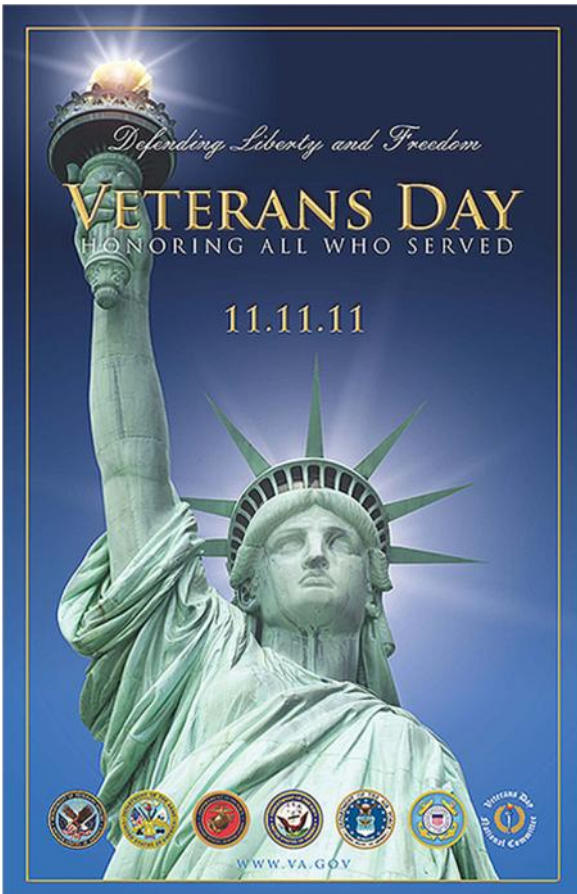
