

A bright blue container has been placed at the mail boxes to accept recyclables: paper, cardboard, plastics and aluminum. No glass. You do not need to sort your paper, cardboard, plastics and aluminum. They can be co-mingled in any of the three compartments. This is being provided by the South Utah Valley Solid Waste District (SUVSWD) free of charge. Woodland Hills is a member of SUVSWD so we will all benefit from the collection.
