WOODLAND HILLS DAYS 2013— SEPTEMBER 6 & 7

- The City Council voted to increase the property tax rate 16% in order to:

1. Install a new well
2. Completely redo Woodland Hills Drive
3. Install a flat containment curb on the side of Woodland Hills Drive to increase the life of the road
4. Replace and enlarge the water line under Woodland Hills Drive
5. Install a conduit up Woodland Hills Drive so internet providers can provide the city better internet service
6. Install a walking path next to the road from Maple Drive down to the church
7. Buy the land and build a salt storage building east of the Church
8. Fix the field at the park

- The Council approved to proceed with obtaining bids for water line/road replacement of Woodland Hills Drive.

- The Council voted to proceed with construction of the Salt Storage Facility.

- The Council passed a resolution indicating the City of Woodland Hills intent of adjusting its boundary with the City of Elk Ridge.

- The Council approved Mountain Villas overlay zone which allows for limited clustering of homes as part of a larger master plan with open space.

- The Council approved a Resolution to Suspend the Road/Drainage Impact Fee.

- The siren by the City Center was repaired and discussions were held on how to improve the message that comes across the siren.
