PROTECTION FROM RADON

Proclamation

Whereas, radon is a colorless, odorless, naturally occurring radioactive gas that threatens the health of our citizens;

Whereas, radon is the second leading cause of lung cancer deaths in the United States and the number one cause among non-smokers;

Whereas, one in 15 homes across the U.S. has an elevated radon level;

Whereas, any home in Woodland Hills may have an elevated level of radon, even if other homes in the same neighborhood do not;

Whereas, testing for radon is simple and inexpensive;

Whereas, identified radon problems can be fixed;

Whereas, Woodland Hills and the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency are supporting efforts to encourage Americans to test their homes for radon, mitigate elevated levels of radon, and build new homes with radon-resistant materials and features;

Now therefore, we declare January Official Radon Action Month in Woodland Hills, UT.
